**CIRCULAR NO.137/ MKTG**

Sub: APSCSCL – Marketing – Procurement of paddy under MSP during KMS 2012-13 – Custom milling of paddy – GOI instructions on CMR deliveries - Reg.

Ref: GOI Lr.No.1(2)/2013-Py.I, dt.10.06.2013 of Joint Secretary (P&FCI), M/o CA, F & PD, D/o F & PD, New Delhi received through CCS.Ref.No.PI(1)/3192/2013, dt.26.06.2013.

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The GOI, vide ref. cited (copy enclosed), have informed that it has been observed for various reasons, CMR rice is not handed over to FCI under central pool in time and so also the levy rice procured, resulting in seeking extension of time again and again for several months even after the end of Marketing Season on 30<sup>th</sup> September every year. It was also informed that the delay in processing of paddy and extensions for delivery of CMR / levy rice could lead to serious malpractices on the part of the millers. Therefore, the following instructions were issued by GOI for delivery of CMR / levy rice for KMS 2012-13:

1. The paddy which has been procured during KMS 2012-13 should be processed timely and due CMR and levy rice procured, if any, should be delivered to FCI positively by 30<sup>th</sup> September 2013.
2. In case due to any constraints on the part of FCI, the delivery of CMR and levy rice procured in KMS 2012-13, an extension of time will be considered for one month at a time and upto three months in all on receipt of a request in prescribed format duly countersigned by the GM (AP Region), FCI, Hyderabad.

3. If the rice is not delivered in time, the State Government will have to deal with the pending quantities at their risk and cost subject to further instructions and as such the concerned quantities will be removed from central pool accounts after the last date is over.

In view of the above instructions of GOI, all Joint Collectors & EOEDs are requested to take the following measures for immediate completion of CMR deliveries within the stipulated time i.e. 30<sup>th</sup> September.2013 for KMS 2012-13:

- To conduct weekly coordination meetings with the with the Rice Millers Association, DSO, DM (CSC) and Area Manager (FCI) and review the progress of CMR deliveries at the District level.
- To fix mill wise weekly /fortnightly targets and direct rice millers for delivery of the CMR as per the targets duly fixing the ratio between the mill levy and custom milling.
- To depute DT (enforcement) at all FCI receiving points to monitor CMR deliveries.
- To fix up responsibility on Joint Custodian Officers for custom milling and delivery of CMR to FCI / CSC under their jurisdiction and to avoid misappropriation of paddy stocks.
- To instruct the District Supply Officer to verify the progress of CMR at the time of issue of MSP certificate to rice millers for delivery of levy rice.
- To instruct the Area Manager (FCI) and DM (CSC) to adjust the levy deliveries against the CMR, if any miller fails to deliver the CMR to FCI / CSC.

Even though the GOI permitted CMR deliveries upto 30<sup>th</sup> September.2013 for KMS 2012-13, **it is requested to take all necessary action for completion of CMR / levy deliveries by the end of July.2013** for early realization of amounts as the Corporation is utilizing cash credit at 13% interest for purchase of paddy. The delay in CMR deliveries will increase interest burden on the Corporation.





The Joint Secretary to Government of India, Ministry of CA,  
F&PD in the reference has informed that it has been decided that the  
paddy which has been procured during the Kharif Marketing season  
under KMS 2012-13 in the State should be processed timely and due  
CMR and levy rice procured, if any, should be delivered to FCI  
positively by 30<sup>th</sup> September, 2013. In case due to any constraints on  
the part of FCI, the delivery of CMR and levy rice procured in KMS  
2012-13, an extension of time will be considered for one month at a  
time and up to three months in all on receipt of a request in prescribed  
format (will be circulated separately) duly countersigned by the GM,  
Region of FCI concerned and if the rice is not delivered in time, the  
State Government will have to deal with the pending quantities at their  
risk and cost subject to further instructions and as such the concerned  
quantities will be removed from the central pool accounts after the  
last date is over and requested to communicate the instructions to all  
concerned in the State for compliance.

I, therefore, request you to take all necessary action for  
completion of CMR/levy deliveries within the prescribed time.

As you are aware, the procurement of paddy gets over by the end of March every year in those States where it is cultivated only during Kharif season. However, in those States where paddy is sown in Rabi season also, the procurement of KMS concerned takes place till June-July and in such States, the processing of paddy should be done during next 2 months and the entire resultant CMR and levy rice procured, if any, should be handed over to FCI under Central Pool stocks positively by 30<sup>th</sup> September of the concerned year. In certain other States, where even though only Kharif crop of paddy is there, due to substantial production, limited milling capacity and availability of limited storage space with FCI, the delivery of CMR or levy rice can be hit prolonged, but, in such States also, the entire resultant CMR and the levy rice procured should be delivered to FCI under Central Pool by 30<sup>th</sup> September of the year. Your State is one such State where delivery of entire CMR and levy rice to FCI is expected to be completed by 30<sup>th</sup> September of the year.

2. Over the years, it has been observed that for various reasons CMR rice is not handed over to FCI under Central Pool in time and so also the levy rice procured (surplus quantity in case of DCP State). Sometimes this results in seeking extension of time again and again for several months even after the end of marketing season on 30<sup>th</sup> September every year. There are apprehensions that this kind of delay in processing of paddy and extensions for delivery of CMR/levy rice could lead to serious malpractices on the part of the millers.

3. Therefore, it has been decided that the paddy which has been procured during the Kharif season under KMS 2012-13 in your State should be processed timely and due CMR and levy rice procured, if any, should be delivered to FCI positively by 30<sup>th</sup> September, 2013. In case due to any constraints on the part of FCI, the delivery of CMR and levy rice procured in KMS 2012-13, an extension of time will be considered for one month at a time and up to three months in all on receipt of a request in prescribed format duly countersigned by the GM, Region of FCI concerned. The format in this regard will be being circulated separately.

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

If the rice is not delivered in time, the State Government will have to deal with the pending quantities at their risk and cost subject to further instructions, which are being issued by this Department separately, and, as such the concerned quantities will be removed from the Central Pool accounts after the last date is over.

5. You are requested to kindly communicate these instructions of all concern in your State for compliance.
