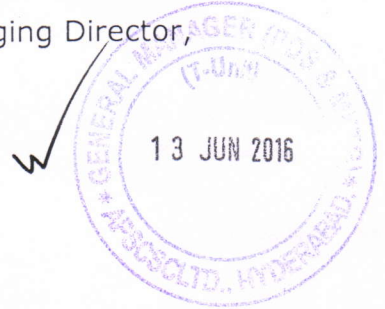

**Subject: Consignee end inspection of Jute Bags-reg.**


Sir,

Kindly refer to this Department letter of even no. dated 10.05.2016 wherein minutes of meeting regarding advance planning of Jute bags for KMS 2016-17 was circulated. It was brought to notice in the meeting that States have not developed adequate infrastructure & training of concerned officials necessary for Consignee end inspection yet.

2. It has been repeatedly informed vide letter no. 15(7)/2014.Py.III (Pt.) dated 20.01.2016 & subsequent letter dated 04.02.2016 that from KMS 2016-17, inspection of jute bags shall be done at consignee end and it is necessary that State Government should be equipped fully in terms of training of staff and infrastructure development at their end. However none of the States are reported to be ready for Consignee end inspection of Jute bags for KMS 2016-17. Reluctance of States to do the needful is nowhere helpful in reduction of complaints. ✓

3. In view of this, it is therefore, requested that DGS&D should continue to perform inspection of Jute bags for KMS 2016-17 and to coordinate with States in developing facilities and training of officials for Consignee end inspection.
